



FOOD AND HEALTH



Food For The Poor Canada provides access to basic needs

- Safe drinking water and sanitation
- Improved nutrition
- Secure housing
- Health-related education and information
- Health care services

In 2015, with our partners and donors we distributed in Haiti and Jamaica:

- 4 containers of medicines, an X-ray machine and Ultrasound machine,
- 2 containers of dried Vegetable soup to hungry children through school feeding programs and churches, hospitals and orphanages.
- 80 computers, school supplies, clothes, soccer balls and more.

EDUCATION

In 2015 FFPC partnered with Helping Hands Jamaica Foundation (HHJF) and three corporate partners, Maple Leaf Sports and Entertainment Inc. (MLSE), Sunwing Foundation and Kisko Products. These school builds were part of a larger, ongoing, island-wide project by Food For The Poor; **FFPJ has built 75 Early Childhood Schools** across the Island over the last four years.
